THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

NO-SHOWS/LATE WITHDRAWALS:

"NB: Withdrawals or no-shows after the date of definite entries will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show. The amount to be charged will be €150.00 per horse"

DECLARATION OF STARTERS:

Entries for the first day must be made at the Show Office on August 27th before 14:00 hrs.

Changes will be possible until **one hour prior to the Horse Inspection**. From this moment, changes won't be possible and horses will have to compete in the classes for which they are entered.

For the following days, **Declarations** for each class must be made at the Starter's stand, placed by the Competitors' Tribune, by signing the daily entry form at the column corresponding with the class where the horse is going to participate.

The O.C. will take charge of the accommodation expenses of the invited foreign participants and the Home Official Team members (Art. 200.6.1.2) and Chefs d'Equipe taking part in the CSIO (bed and continental breakfast) from August 27th (at noon) to September 3rd (at noon).

Individual Spanish participants must take charge of their accommodation expenses.

Additional costs (bar, telephone, supplements...) will be in the charge of those concerned.

Meals: at the expense of $\underline{OC} \times \underline{Athletes}$ if from August 27th (dinner) to September 3rd (breakfast).

The invited foreign riders and Chefs d'Equipe taking part in the C.S.I.O. will receive tickets for lunch for the Horse Show Restaurant and ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY EUROS ($150 \in$) for dinner - in cash or in tickets- to exchange in the establishments indicated by the O.C.

2. GROOMS

Requests for accommodation must be sent with entries.

Cost of accommodation (only for team grooms) will be at the cost of $\underline{OC} \times \underline{Athletes}$ from August 27th (at noon) to September 3rd (at noon), only **in case it would be requested with nominative entries**.

Cost of accomodation will be at the cost of **Athletes** if request is received after the closing date for nominative entries.

Grooms will be accommodated in double rooms.

The O.C. can arrange reservations for one groom per rider -only for the grooms of the invited NF teams- Reservation fees will be at the cost of the O.C but, in case a confirmed hotel reservation were not occupied, the total cost of the stay will be paid by the NF concerned.

Requests for accommodation must be sent in writing with the entries, at the latest by August 7th. **The O.C. will not accept any request received after this date.**

Facilities (free of charge):

- Lorries: Power points and parking place available inside the riding centre (next to the stables)
- **Showers and toilets** for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water.

Horses will be stabled free of charge in boxes at the official stables close to the competition arena, from Monday August 26th at 8,00 till Tuesday September 3rd at noon.

As bedding is free of charge for each horse taking part in the CSIO, all athletes will receive a lump sum of 90 € per horse for bedding, in order to arrange beds according to preference.

IMPORTANT: We inform all the riders that the O.C. can't offer additional boxes at the Horse Show stables. Horses not competing at the Show will not be accepted in any case.

Shavings, hay and straw available at the Stables store of Las Mestas. Open times will be confirmed later.

Agent and veterinary fees for entering and leaving the frontier of the host country and/or to the show ground will be arranged and paid by the Organising Committee.

The OC may charge a manure disposal fee of max. EUR 40.-/horse/event.

Riders classified after the thirteenth, eliminated or retired will not receive any points. In case of "exaequo" for any position, even the first place, points will be shared in the same way as the prizes.

The classification will be done by adding the points of each horse-rider in all the qualifying classes.

The winner will be the horse-rider with the most points.

In case of "ex-aequo" for the first place, the first horse-rider will be the one who has obtained the greatest number of first placings, the same for the second placings and so on.

3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

The prize-giving ceremonies will be held at the end of each class. Competitors are asked to be attentive to the Director's instructions and to collaborate with him for the success of these ceremonies.

The owner of the winning horse **is** invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix.

The number of athletes required to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony of each competition is **five or ten** (according to the conditions of each class). They will have to go to the arena riding their horses.

4. INSURANCES

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

They must ensure too that their personal insurances (individual accident, sickness etc.) are valid:

- For their sporting activity
- For the country in which this activity takes place

The Organizing Committee and the Officials and all persons working for the Organising Committee will not be held responsible for accidents or illness suffered by competitors, or other people, grooms horses or properties, including theft and loss, inside or outside the Riding Centre, during or after the classes.

Should a competitor's insurance fail to provide proper compensation, the Organiser's Civil Liability Insurance can in no case be applied. It is their responsibility to provide for the costs of any necessary repatriation should the situation necessitate due to accident. Consequently, the competitors will renounce any claim against the Organiser.

Competitors horses and material remain under their charge and responsibility during the whole event.



The FEI insures all FEI Officials, whose names are published in the FEI Officials lists, against third party liability including Judges, Course Designers, Technical Delegates, FEI Stewards, FEI Veterinary Delegates, Para Classifiers, Members of the Judges' Supervisory Panel and FEI Coaches (FEI MCP Veterinarians are covered under a different policy):

- Who are acting for or on behalf of the FEI as stated in the approved schedule of the Event or who are acting in the scope and course of the FEI's Business as described in the final approved schedule; and
- Who have received the status of FEI Officials at FEI Events through a qualification process.
 - The FEI will NOT insure:
- National officials officiating at FEI Events; and/or
- FEI Officials, who have no official function at the Event.

The insurance extended is for any liability that the FEI Official incurs to a third party, and for the costs of defending any such claim arising as a result of actions undertaken by the FEI Official in good faith (including errors and omissions) on behalf of the FEI. However, the insurance for obvious reasons does not extend to any liabilities incurred as a result of an FEI Official's dishonest, fraudulent, malicious, and/or illegal act.

Should an FEI Official become aware of an incident that he or she believes might result in a claim, that FEI Official should notify the FEI immediately and provide all of the facts known to the FEI Official. The FEI cannot guarantee the insurance coverage described above in circumstances where the FEI Official has good cause to believe that there might be a claim and does not provide such timely notice directly to the FEI.

5. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS/ACCREDITED PERSONS

Show Office will be open from August 26th.

All the **Officials**, **Participants and their** Companions (one per rider), Team Officials (Chefs d'Equipe, Veterinarian, Trainer)Horse Owners (maximum two per horse) and **Grooms** must indicate their names, surnames and functions to the Organising Committee at the Show Office in order to be given the necessary admission authorization for the venue and for the stable area.

Access to the stable area is carried out according to the recommendations of the FEI.

Stable security will be enforced and access to the stables will be restricted.

8. PROTESTS/APPEALS

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

9. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Unforeseen circumstances do not include situations arising as a results of the OC altering the approved Schedule without FEI's authorisation. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

10. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Riders wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These riders will start first in these competitions.

11. DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

12. RESULTS

In order to proceed with the results publication and for qualification purposes the FEI requires results to be sent in immediately after the conclusion of the event.

Horses registered will be included in groups called SERIES. The duration of the interval between two SERIES will be announced by the loud speaker at the beginning of each interval.

The technical meeting with the officials of the CSIO will take place at the Press Room, on August 27^{th} ath 18:00 hrs.

- Horse expedition

Those that travel by road will have to go straight to the "Complejo Deportivo de Las Mestas". (Stables entrance / Latitude: 43.52766 / Longitude: -5.63475)

- Horse selling:

According to the Customs General Management Instructions, no temporary imported horse can stay in Spain without having a definite import permit.

If in the moment of the re-exportation of the horses there is one missing, the whole expedition will be retain at the border.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

ENTRY OF HORSES

3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

The following documents will be necessary for Spanish Authorities:

- 1. Horses coming from Spain: Transport and health certificate
- 2. Horses coming from EU: International Transport Certificate valid between EU members

3. Horses coming from other countries: Valid Certificate which is required at moment of import.



4. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in vehicles suitable for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, and the Horse be in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have a responsibility to be in compliance of national legislation in both the country of origin, return, and the host nation of the Event; where necessary Athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

5. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

PASSPORTS **General Regulations Article 137**

For all Horses FEI Passports/FEI Recognition Cards issues, please address to your National Federation

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards - for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI, are compulsory for FEI Events, with the exception of CNs and CIMs as outlined below.

Athletes whose Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card is not correctly validated, or failing to meet other requirements for vaccination and Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication control (Veterinary Regulations Article 1030) will be subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex II of the Veterinary Regulations.

Athletes will be required to write their name and counter sign next to any passport irregularity entry noted, as an acknowledgement, prior to receiving the passport and leaving the show ground. Following a warning being issued for such an irregularity the Athlete will have 30 days to correct this, failure to correct such irregularities within 30 days will result in a sanction being imposed.

Note for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union, all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations, to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA 2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1028

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below. Update 26.11.2012. 21

Exceptions to the requirement for FEI equine influenza vaccinations currently exist only for those Horses competing at CNs or CIMs where there are no national requirements for influenza vaccination in both the Event host country and the Horse's country of origin (General Regulations Article 137).

EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL 2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1032

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport, their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, with regards to vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

HORSE INSPECTIONS 2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1033

All Horses will be assessed for their orthopaedic fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit not to compete will be eliminated by the Ground Jury and not be permitted to continue in the competition.

LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION

All Horses competing at the Event are subject throughout the Period of the Event to Examination under Article 1034 of the Veterinary Regulations, the Limb Sensitivity Protocol. The objectives of the Protocol are to: (i) safeguard the welfare of the horse, according to the principles outlined in the Code of Conduct for the Horse, and (ii) to ensure a level playing field for all Athletes. Horses are not eligible to compete when a limb, or part of a limb, is hyposensitive or hypersensitive. Hypersensitive limbs have an excessive or abnormal reaction to palpation. Hyposensitive limbs include any alteration in sensitivity induced by a neurectomy or chemical desensitisation for as long as the alteration in sensitivity persists.



Horses may be examined under the Protocol at any time during the Period of the Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off and they may be examined once or on multiple occasions. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the Examination or are subject to immediate Disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses during the Event.

6. <u>EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION</u> 2013 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VI EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)

Within FEI Groups I & II, the Organising Committee should charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 towards the cost of the EADCMP, which is affected by the FEI Veterinary Department.

SAMPLING

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures (2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1058).

CLEAN SPORT INFORMATION

The current FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications is available on the FEI Clean Sport website: <u>www.FEICleanSport.org</u> as a PDF document, database or smart phone app. Detection times are also provided for a limited number of Controlled Medication substances where available.

Elective Testing may be carried out, by Competitors for their Horses, prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances (please refer to <u>www.FEI.org/veterinary</u> for information and details).

7. <u>VETERINARY TREATMENTS, SUPPORTIVE AND OTHER THERAPIES 2013</u> Veterinary Regulations Chapter V

Veterinary treatment or supportive therapy required during an Event is under the control of the FEI Veterinary Official (Veterinary Delegate) and only permitted when:

- a) authorised using the appropriate Veterinary Form (see table below, or VRs article 1047-1051), either prior to the competition or prior to administration once the competition has begun;
- b) conducted within the designated Treatment Boxes and
- c) administered by an FEI Veterinarian (VRs article 1003) or Other Treating Professional (VRs article 1021).

Heated or magnetic blankets, physical therapy, ice and cold water, non-prohibited, authorised substances that are administered orally or by nebulisation, or those treatments exceptionally authorised by the Veterinary Delegate are allowed in the Horse's own stable.

Supervision of all such treatments by FEI Officials may take place directly on a random check basis or by requesting to see a copy of the relevant authorisation. No treatments may take place without coming under such control and authority, except in the case of a clear emergency, when a retrospective authority may be considered if the Horse is to continue.

8. <u>VETERINARIANS AT EVENTS</u>

2013 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter II

VETERINARY SERVICES MANAGER (VSM)

All Organising Committees must appoint a FEI Veterinarian as a Veterinary Services Manager to be responsible for assisting the organiser in achieving the Minimum Veterinary Standards and facilities required for an FEI Event. The VSM must ensure sufficient numbers of treating veterinarians are available for the type of Event and the number of Horses attending. The VSM may be the event treating veterinarian themselves.



FEI VETERINARIANS

All veterinarians treating Horses during FEI Events, including Team Veterinarians, Athlete's Private Veterinarians and Treating Veterinarians must be registered with the FEI as FEI Veterinarians – either Permitted Treating or Official Veterinarians. Veterinarians must carry their FEI ID Card with them at all times when in attendance at Events and must present this on the request of FEI Stewards or Officials. Athletes are advised to ensure that any veterinarian they wish to treat their Horse during an Event is registered in the correct way with the FEI. Registering as an FEI Veterinarian does not give any automatic right to having accreditation which is issued by the event Organising Committee.

9. NOTES TO ORGANISING COMMITTEES

FEI Veterinary Delegates must verify that adequate facilities and services are provided by the Organising Committee prior to the start of the Event, and ensure that FEI Stewards are aware of the requirements for the authorisation of Veterinary Forms, other treatments and the FEI Veterinarian ID Card during Events.

Organising Committees must also ensure that there are adequately trained stewards or designated individuals who will liaise with FEI Veterinary Officials to assist with the supervision of treatment areas. The Veterinary Forms 1-4 must be kept by the FEI Veterinary Delegate, referenced and submitted in their report to the FEI within 72 hours.

10. PONIES

For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement prior to the Horse Inspection (2013 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IV).

X. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

At a minimum, and pursuant to the ADRHAs, Organisers must provide the following at Events where human anti-doping testing is scheduled to take place at least 2 months prior to the Event:

1. One (1) staff member able to act as point of contact and coordinator for the *Doping Control Officers* (*DCOs*) with the contact name and details of this staff member to be communicated to the *FEI* at least two (2) weeks prior to the starting date of the *Event*.

2. Human anti-doping facilities reasonably separated from public activity, consisting of:

- one (1) private room exclusively dedicated for use by the *DCOs* with one (1) table, two (2) chairs, pens and paper and one (1) lockable fridge; and

- a waiting room/area with a suitable number of chairs as well as an appropriate amount of individually sealed, non-caffeinated and non alcoholic beverages, which includes a mix of natural mineral water and soft drinks ; and

- one (1) private and clean bathroom/toilet, adjacent or as near as possible to the *DCO* room and waiting area.

3. Staff members (or volunteers) of both genders, able to act as *Chaperones*. The number of *Chaperones* available to the *OC* must be communicated to the *FEI* as early as possible following receipt by the *OC* of the *Testing* plan for the *Event*. Please see the qualifications for Chaperones in the ADRHAS.

International competitions must not start before 08:00 and should not finish after 23:00 unless approved by the FEI.

Money prizes will be paid BY BANK TRANSFER. For this purpose, all Athletes are requested to state their bank data (name of recipient, bank name, bank code, account number, IBAN, and BIC codes) together with the definite entries. (See Annex II)

The prize money won will be paid after deduction o any possible outstanding debts of the respective rider y/or his horses' owners at or in connection with the CSIO.

EACH ATHLETE IS REQUESTED TO CHECK AND SIGN THE FINAL ACCOUNT AT THE ACCOUNTING OFFICE BEFORE DEPARTURE. THE HORSE PASSPORTS WILL ONLY BE HANDED BACK AFTER THE ACCOUNTS HAVE BEEN SETTLED.

Entries and other costs have to be paid at the Show Office once checked final accounts. Payment by credit card or in cash (Euros). Checks are not accepted.
