

#### **1. ATHLETES**

- Lived-in horse boxes/caravans will receive electricity € 10,00 per day. The OC will only guarantee electricity to those who make their request together with the definite entries

#### 3. GROOMS

No accommodation is provided for grooms by OC.

• Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC.

OCs must provide sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms. These must be regularly maintained in a proper state of cleanliness.

#### 4. HORSES / PONIES

- No facilities are offered for transportation of horses.
   Stables will be allocated on arrival but PLEASE MAKE SPECIAL REQUESTS (e.g. stallions) with definitive entries.
- All horses will be bedded on **shavings.**
- Horses must be stabled within the FEI stable area for the duration of the event.
- Stables will be closed between 10.00 PM and 6.30 AM
- No horse may leave the stable area during the closing time without the specific authorization of the Chief Steward unless there is an emergency.
- Horses may not leave their boxes without the official show starting number.

# DEPARTURE: all horses must leave the venue by 10:00 am on Monday 10/10/11)

Non-competing horses must be presented at the Horse Inspection for identification and vaccination control.

CSI1\* - CSIYH1\* : Horses taking part in CSI1\*/CSIYH1\* in their country of nationality are not required to have an FEI passport.

#### 5. ADDITIONAL FEES





- It is possible to have stable arrangements before Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2011 for horses that are in Italy for some other Shows only if requested with definite Entries (€ 30,00 per horse each day).
- The first bedstead is provided by the OC free of charge. It is possible to buy hay and shavings paying at the secretary office.
- The OC must be informed by 5th September 2011 of any riders intending to bring non competing horses. A charge of € 150,00 will be levied for each non-competing horse to cover stabling cost.

# THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

## FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

# 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.


