

Those hours will be announced. As stabling is limited, boxes for extra, not competitive horses or a tack-box can only be provided if asked before to the OC, at the price of $125 \in$ for every extra stable.

NO SMOKING IN THE STABLES

All dung must be dropped in special containers at the stables. If violation stated by the stable manager, or by smoking in the stables, the ground jury can demand up to **1.000 CHF**.

Any horse entering on the Belgium Territory, whatever its country of origin outside EECF, must have a temporary Import authorization.for horses coming form abroad a health certificate proved that they are free from contagious disorders must be presented.

Non EC competitors are strongly advised to travel by ATA carnet

There is not travel agency in charge

The custom clearance should be made at the border. Custom formalities are at the competitors expenses..

NFs holding an international event in their country should inform their National Veterinary Authority and their Customs Authority at least four weeks beforehand. They should request every facility to assist the movement of horses accompanied by FEI Passports, and the necessary veterinary certification at frontier crossing points into and out of their countries. (Vet. Regl Art. 1004.2) Riders who need health papers for the horses/*ponies to cross the border, will have to pay the costs charged by the Ministry (37,5€ per health paper) The request documents has to be made at the secretary's office at arrival, anyway before Friday 27/05/11 before 12 a.m.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
