THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

1. EVENTING MEDICAL CARD

All competitors must carry readily accessible on themselves a medical card for the Cross-Country Test. Armbands must be checked by the Official Doctor and the Technical Delegate for accurate information.

2. INSURANCES

Details pertaining to insurance of competitors, horses, etc.

Responsibility of OC for damages, fire, theft, etc

"All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy up to date".

Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers, Fidelity Blenheim Palace International Horse Trials, The British Equestrian Federation, British Eventing, The Trustee of the Blenheim Palace Estate nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for accident, loss, damage, injury, illness to any horse, owner, athlete, groom, spectators, exhibitors, dogs, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever

The FEI insures all FEI Officials, whose names are published in the FEI Officials lists, against third party liability including Judges, Course Designers, Technical Delegates, FEI Stewards, FEI Veterinary Delegates, Para Classifiers, Members of the Judges' Supervisory Panel, Members of the Appeal committee (FEI MCP Veterinarians are covered under a different policy):

- Who are acting for or on behalf of the FEI as stated in the approved schedule of the Event or who are acting in the scope and course of the FEI's Business as described in the final approved schedule; and
- Who have received the status of FEI Officials at FEI Events through a qualification process.

3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

Top 20 competitors (top 10 for CIC) must parade in main arena and collect their rosettes lower placed athletes who complete all phases may collect their completion rosettes and plaque from the Competitors and Owners Liaison Officer at the Stables

4. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 132)

The competitor will be given three wristlets for their personal use (Competitor, groom, partner or trainer) on event which will permit access into the stables field, secure stables compound, and all event areas including D box. The owners registered in the horses FEI passport will be sent their passes separately from those received by the competitor.

Each Competitor will be provided with one lorry pass and one competitors and owners car pass (car park is sited opposite the stables field). These passes and any electrical hook up pass for the lorry must be displayed in the lorry/ Car windscreen at all times.

Please note: Competitors wristlets allow access to all aspects of the site (crucially including the secure stables compound) and should not be removed or given to any person other than those who should have full access to all areas to secure areas (i.e. grooms and competitors)

Each owner registered with BE or the FEI and listed on the horses FEI passport will directly receive two owners wristlets and one competitors and owners car pass. The wristlets give access to the D box and competitors stables field, event site including VIP Members pavilion alongside the Marlborough Arena. Should Owners wish to visit their horse within the secure stables compound itself, they may do so by signing in the day book at the Stable Managers Office.

Competitors may purchase further admission tickets or passes to the event for their friends or family at 50% of gate price up until 6th September through the website www.blenheim-horse.co.uk using the promotional code RIDER13

Access to the secure stables compound

Access to stables will be limited to persons indicated in Veterinary regulation Art 1005.2.3 and strict security will be in place.

All horses must be 'checked in' with the Veterinary Delegate **before** being admitted to the secure stabling this must be before the riders briefing at 13.00 on Wednesday 10^{th} September.

Competitors should leave ample time to allow for 'check in' and must have their horses FEI passports ready for inspection. Passports will be retained until the end of the competition by the Veterinary Delegate.

No horse will be permitted into the stables before 12.00 Tuesday unless by prior arrangement. Stables officially open at on Tuesday 10th September at 12.00. No horse may leave the site prior to Sunday 15th September unless it is eliminated, withdrawn or otherwise retired and has been 'signed out' by the Veterinary Delegate.

No horses must be brought to the event other than those competing or as agreed with the Organising committee in advance – all horses stabled within the secure stables compound must be fully compliant with FEI vaccination regulations.

Horses will be checked at night by the Stable Manager and Veterinary Teams who will immediately contact the groom / athlete listed on the horse contact details if anything untoward occurs or horses need water or attention.

Grooms Athletes, Owners and connections are encouraged no to disturb the horses



within the secure stables compound between 21.00 and 06.00 unless summoned by the Veterinary or Stable Management Team.

Movement of horses between the stables, practice, grazing and main arena is strictly controlled and athletes must observe instructions provided within their competitors packs and from on event stewards.

Access to practice areas is controlled so that the Chief Steward can ensure that stewards are in place and FEI regulation are observed – please refer to competitors pack for full details.

5. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES AND HORSES

The Athletes are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with Art. 541 of the FEI Rules for Eventing. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on Athletes and horses complies with these Articles.

Athletes give the absolute right and permission for any photograph and / or film or video or TV footage taken of persons or horses taking part in the event to be used and published in any media whatsoever for editorial purposes, press information or advertising by or on behalf of the event and / or the event's official sponsors.

6. PROTESTS (Art. 163-168)

All protests, to be valid, must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150 or equivalent.

7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 109-110)

The OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. All modifications made to the schedule must have the approval of the FEI Secretary General.

OCs of International Events must inform the FEI and NFs whose teams or individuals have taken part, of the results and prize money paid to each placed Athlete and team, within five (5) days following the Event, unless otherwise specified for qualification and ranking reasons as communicated by the FEI.

The OC notes that Riders are welcome to take part in organised course walks (over 10 people) for Blenheim sponsors or other approved organisations <u>providing</u> permission to undertake these has been given by the Event Organiser but politely request that MUST keep their parties off the cross country course in order to conserve the going for the horses.

When walking on the course itself during the event itself riders are asked to wear their number bibs so they can easily be identified as being permitted to be inside the string.

8. DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

9. RESULTS

All results must include FEI Passport Registration number of horses and FEI ID numbers of Riders.

All athletes who have not completed the event must appear on the results



X. VETERINARY MATTERS VETERINARY REGULATIONS (VRs), 13th edition, effective 1 January 2013

NB: Peden bloodstock must be supplied with all information needed for import and export of horses at least 10 days before the arrival of the horse in the UK and to comply with DEFRA regulations plans should be with Peden 4 weeks before arrival.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

ENTRY OF HORSES

All horses from EC nations must be accompanied by official health certificates which must show their FEI passport number, The FEI passport must accompany the horse at all times. The certificate is not required for horses from Ireland or France.

Horses from outside the EC must be accompanied by a health certificate appropriate to their country of origin; details of the correct certificate and of any blood tests which may be needed can be obtained from the official transport agents. The certificate will allow the horse to remain in the EC for a maximum of 90 days; should any athlete intend to keep his horse in Britain longer than this period then Peden Bloodstock will provide details of the permanent health certificate including information on the blood tests and pre export isolation which may apply.

Customs Documentation: Horses arriving from outside the EC must arrive with an ATA Carnet issued in the country of origin, to cover the horse and its accompanying equipment. Should any horse travel without an ATA Carnet then either the National Federation or athlete concerned will be responsible for the costs in connection with temporary import into the EC.

British export welfare Regulations: Special export licences are required for every horse leaving the country; these are issued by DEFRA and Peden Bloodstock will obtain them providing the essential information is supplied at least ten days before the start of the event at the athletes expense.

In order to comply with the welfare regulations athletes should bear in mind that it may be obligatory for their horses to be stabled for a minimum of ten hours rest either en route to the port of export, or at the official lairage stables for that port.



AS EC regulations on animal welfare during transport are constantly reviewed and may be altered at any time any queries on this subject should be addressed to Peden Bloodstock Ltd who will do their best to provide the information, If any major changes do come into effect after the entry date Peden Bloodstock will endeavour to contact each athlete or their federation directly.

Export Health Certificates: Peden Bloodstock will arrange for a health certificate to be issued to the veterinary surgeon at the event for each horse to return to its origin, providing the essential information on the return travel plan is given to them a minimum of ten days before the start of the event. The veterinary surgeon will complete this health certificate at the athletes expense.

Please note: The Organising Committee will not be responsible for any taxes, fines or costs which may be due if any horse or equipment does not return to its country of origin at the end of the event. Should any claim be made against the Organising Committee for any taxes, fines or costs which have remained in Great Britain or the European Union the National Federation making the entry will be responsible for paying these.

3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Any national restrictions in place at time of the event will be adhered to

4. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in vehicles suitable for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, and the Horse be in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have a responsibility to be in compliance of national legislation in both the country of origin, return, and the host nation of the Event; where necessary Athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

5. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

PASSPORTS General Regulations Article 137

For all Horses FEI Passports/FEI Recognition Cards issues, please address to your National Federation

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards are compulsory for FEI Events

Athletes whose Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card is not correctly validated, or failing to meet other requirements for vaccination and Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication control (Veterinary Regulations Article 1030) will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex II of the Veterinary Regulations**.



Athletes will be required to write their name and counter sign next to any passport irregularity entry noted, as an acknowledgement, prior to receiving the passport and leaving the show ground. Following a warning being issued for such an irregularity the Athlete will have 30 days to correct this, failure to correct such irregularities within 30 days will result in a sanction being imposed.

Note for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union, all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations, to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA 2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1028

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport, their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, with regards to vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

HORSE INSPECTIONS

All Horses will be assessed for their orthopaedic fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit not to compete



will be eliminated by the Ground Jury and not be permitted to continue in the competition.

6. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION

Within FEI Groups I & II, the Organising Committee should charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 towards the cost of the EADCMP, which is affected by the FEI Veterinary Department. This fee will be absorbed by the OC

SAMPLING

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures (2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1058).

CLEAN SPORT INFORMATION

The current FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications is available on the FEI Clean Sport website: www.FEICleanSport.org as a PDF document, database or smart phone app. Detection times are also provided for a limited number of Controlled Medication substances where available.

Elective Testing may be carried out, by Competitors for their Horses, prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances (please refer to www.FEI.org/veterinary for information and details).

7. VETERINARY TREATMENTS, SUPPORTIVE AND OTHER THERAPIES 2013

Veterinary treatment or supportive therapy required during an Event is under the control of the FEI Veterinary Official (Veterinary Delegate) and only permitted when:

- a) authorised using the appropriate Veterinary Form (see table below, or VRs article 1047-1051), either prior to the competition or prior to administration once the competition has begun;
- b) conducted within the designated Treatment Boxes and
- c) administered by an FEI Veterinarian (VRs article 1003) or Other Treating Professional (VRs article 1021).

Heated or magnetic blankets, physical therapy, ice and cold water, non-prohibited, authorised substances that are administered orally or by nebulisation, or those treatments exceptionally authorised by the Veterinary Delegate are allowed in the Horse's own stable.

Supervision of all such treatments by FEI Officials may take place directly on a random check basis or by requesting to see a copy of the relevant authorisation.

No treatments may take place without coming under such control and authority, except in the case of a clear emergency, when a retrospective authority may be considered if the Horse is to continue.

8. VETERINARIANS AT EVENTS

All veterinarians treating Horses during FEI Events, including Team Veterinarians, Athlete's Private Veterinarians and Treating Veterinarians must be registered with the FEI as FEI Veterinarians – either Permitted Treating or Official Veterinarians. Veterinarians must carry their FEI ID Card with them at all times when in attendance at Events and must present this on the request of FEI Stewards or Officials. Athletes are advised to ensure that any veterinarian they wish to treat their Horse during an Event is registered in the correct way with the FEI. Registering as an FEI Veterinarian does not give any automatic right to having accreditation which is issued by the Event Organising Committee.
