11. STARTING ORDER & TIME TABLE

Riders need to declare their horses for the next day the previous day **before 18.00h** at the sport office on official forms. The entries for Friday have to be done Thursday 8 September before 18h00. **The entries for the classes on Thursday have to be done before 15h.**

The starting order for the competitions will be as followed:

I) Class 1-7 & 9 + I-VI On rotation
II) Grand Prix 8 Random Draw

Athletes wishing to school in speed competitions, must inform the OC before these competitions take place. These athletes start first.

Qualification for the Grand Prix: the best 40 athletes from the big class on Friday and the best 40 athletes of the big class on Saturday will be allowed to participate in the Grand Prix on Sunday, each athlete with 1 horse. If an athlete qualifies in class 3 on Friday and also in class 6 on Saturday, the 41^{st} of Friday will be allowed to participate, then the 41^{st} of Saturday, the 42^{nd} of Friday, the 42^{nd} of Saturday and so on. This means that maximum 80 combinations will be allowed to participate in the



Grand Prix.

12. EVENT's ORGANISATION (Art. 114-115)

In exceptional circumstances together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
