# THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

# **FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

# IX. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

#### 1. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES AND HORSES:

The Athletes **are** authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with Art. 256.3 and 257.3 of the FEI Rules for Jumping. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on Athletes and horses complies with these Articles.

### 2. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS

A. Leading athlete award -

Prix du Vainqueur

#### Leading rider award: Prix du Vainqueur

Prize of honor and an amount of € 2.500,= for the athlete, being the best classified during the entire CSI 4\* Amsterdam - 2014. The classification will be established as follows:

In all competitions (with the exception of competition S-5) points are awarded according to the following system: The winner gets as many points as the total number of athletes starting in the competition; the second placed athlete gets one point less etc. In case of ex-aequo placing all respective athletes will receive the points corresponding to their placing. Athletes eliminated or having retired will receive no points; however, this does not apply to eliminations or retirements during any jump-off or second phase/round.

Notwithstanding the above, the points obtained in each competition will be multiplied by a coefficient, as indicated in the prize money chart, displayed on page 19 of this schedule.

In case of equality of points for the first place of the final ranking of the Prix du Vainqueur, the best result obtained in competition S-8 will be decisive. Should this result be equal also, the best result obtained in competition S-3 will first serve as tie breaker; subsequently, in case of further equality, the best result obtained in competition S-6 will be decisive.

During the CSI 4\* Amsterdam (NED) – 2014, the current leading athlete in the provisional Prix du Vainqueur standings will be requested to wear a special armband. The provisional classification will be updated following each competition, the results of which are counting for the Prix du Vainqueur ranking.

### **B. PRIZE - CLASSIFICATION**

#### 3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

Following each competition a distribution of prizes will take place; with the exception of the Grand Prix: athletes up to and including the  $6^{th}$  place will be invited to attend to each prize giving ceremony.

For the Grand Prix, athletes up to and including the 8<sup>th</sup> place will be invited to attend to the prize giving ceremony. The owner(s) of the winning horse(s) of the Grand Prix is (are) entitled to attend to the prize giving ceremony.

#### 4. INSURANCES

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The Organizing Committee will not accept responsibility for any accident happening to owners, participants, grooms, to or because of their horses to third parties in whichever circumstances, inside or outside the show grounds, during, before or after competitions. The civil and financial responsibility of the Organizing Committee and its co-operators will never be liable in any circumstance.

The FEI insures all FEI Officials, whose names are published in the FEI Officials lists, against third party liability including Judges, Course Designers, Technical Delegates, FEI Stewards, FEI Veterinary Delegates, Para Classifiers, Members of the Judges' Supervisory Panel and FEI Coaches (FEI MCP Veterinarians are covered under a different policy):

- Who are acting for or on behalf of the FEI as stated in the approved schedule of the Event or who are acting in the scope and course of the FEI's Business as described in the final approved schedule; and
- Who have received the status of FEI Officials at FEI Events through a qualification process.

The FEI will NOT insure:

- National officials officiating at FEI Events; and/or
- FEI Officials, who have no official function at the Event.

The insurance extended is for any liability that the FEI Official incurs to a third party, and for the costs of defending any such claim arising as a result of actions undertaken by the FEI Official in good faith (including errors and omissions) on behalf of the FEI. However, the insurance for obvious reasons does not extend to any liabilities incurred as a result of an FEI Official's dishonest, fraudulent, malicious, and/or illegal act.

Should an FEI Official become aware of an incident that he or she believes might result in a claim, that FEI Official should notify the FEI immediately and provide all of the facts known to the FEI Official. The FEI cannot guarantee the insurance coverage described above in circumstances where the FEI Official has good cause to believe that there might be a claim and does not provide such timely notice directly to the FEI.

### 5. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS/ACCREDITED PERSONS

There will be free access to the show grounds for the athletes, their partners, grooms, owners of participating horses and officials. The necessary accreditation should be collected from the accreditation centre upon arrival. Per athlete 1 groom maximum will be accredited. A maximum of two owners per participating horse, will be accredited, providing their names are duly registered as such in the official FEI-passport, of the relevant horse's passport.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to withdraw, confiscate or otherwise any passes whether issued with entry or purchased, without refund, immediately in the event that they are either cut, removed or in any way damaged. Passes are non-transferable once issued. All athletes, owners, grooms and other persons must display relevant passes at all times, otherwise entry will be refused.

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

#### 9. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Unforeseen circumstances do not include situations arising as a results of the OC altering the approved Schedule without FEI's authorisation. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

All modifications made to the schedule after approval by the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) must have the approval of the Secretary General of the FEI. Having received Ground Jury approval the Organizing Committee may alter the timings or cancel any of the competitions, as necessities of the programme may require.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to take all necessary action, including canceling or shortening the CSI Amsterdam – 2014, due to special and/or unforeseen circumstances, which in the opinion of the Organizing Committee, would make the continuation of the event unjustified;; any such decision will be taken in agreement with the Secretary General of the FEI. No consequential liability whatsoever can be accepted in such occasion. Gen.Reg. 115.1 and 115.2.

#### 10. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Riders wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These riders will start first in these competitions.

# 11. DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

# 12. RESULTS (Subject to changes)

In order to proceed with the results publication and for qualification purposes the FEI requires results to be sent in immediately after the conclusion of the event.

#### 14. RESPONSIBILITY

The Organizing Committee (including their employees, representatives and show officials) will not be responsible for any accident, injury or damage that may occur to, or any illness or disease which may be contracted by any horse entered at the CSI Amsterdam - 2014 however occurring, and the competitors shall keep the Organizing Committee indemnified against all liability whatever arising from any accident, injury, damage, illness or disease.

Athletes recognize and accept that all equestrian sports involve inherent risks and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. Consequently, by entering their horse(s) for CSI Amsterdam (NED) – 2014 they accept the risk and hold harmless the Organizing Committee, the FEI, the officials, agents, employees and their representatives.

The Organizers will not be in any way liable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to property brought into the event or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatever in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to the actions of the Organizing Committee (including their employees, representatives and show officials) or any of their officers, or agents or these or any other rules or regulations special conditions prescribed by the event.

Each athlete will be considered responsible in all aspects for the attendants in charge of his horses and for any other servants or agents of his for the consequences of any infringement by any such persons of these rules and regulations.

#### 15. GENERAL

Competitors and others involved in the CSI Amsterdam - 2014 must make themselves conversant with these general regulations in addition to the special conditions applicable to the various competitions.

Riders may only compete on the understanding that they comply with and are bound by these regulations and the special conditions relating to each competition. Moreover any official entry of a horse for the event automatically entails the horse owner's formal and unconditional approval, regarding his/her horse's presence at and participation in the CSI Amsterdam (NED) - 2014.

# 2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

#### **GENERAL**

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

### **ENTRY OF HORSES**

Horses may not arrive earlier than Thursday January  $23^{rd}$  2014 / 11hrs00 am and must depart no later than Monday January  $27^{th}$  2014/ 09hrs00 am, unless otherwise agreed upon in advance with the Organizing Committee.

# 3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

For each horse coming into The Netherlands from abroad the following documents must be provided:

- 1. An international FEI-passport or a national passport, approved by the FEI;
- 2. A valid health certificate;
- 3. Non EU competitors are strongly advised to use an ATA carnet, issued and approved by the local Chamber of Commerce. The carnet has to be opened by the customs in your country.

### 4. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in vehicles suitable for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, and the Horse be in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have a responsibility to be in compliance of national legislation in both the country of origin, return, and the host nation of the Event; where necessary Athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

# 5. <u>VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE</u>

#### **PASSPORTS**

**General Regulations Article 137** 

# <u>For all Horses FEI Passports/FEI Recognition Cards issues, please address to your National Federation</u>

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards - for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI, are compulsory for FEI Events, with the exception of CNs and CIMs as outlined below.

Athletes whose Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card is not correctly validated, or failing to meet other requirements for vaccination and Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication control (Veterinary Regulations Article 1030) will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex II of the Veterinary Regulations**.

Athletes will be required to write their name and counter sign next to any passport irregularity entry noted, as an acknowledgement, prior to receiving the passport and leaving the show ground. Following a warning being issued for such an irregularity the Athlete will have 30 days to correct this, failure to correct such irregularities within 30 days will result in a sanction being imposed.

Note for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union, all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations, to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

# 2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1028

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

VACCINATION	PROTOCOL	ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER VENUE
Primary Course	1 <sup>st</sup> Vaccination: day 0 (e.g. 1 January 2010) 2 <sup>nd</sup> Vaccination: day 21-92 (e.g. 1 February 2010)	May compete 7 days after the 2 <sup>nd</sup> Vaccination
First Booster	Within 7 months of the 2 <sup>nd</sup> vaccination of the Primary Course (e.g. 1 August 2010)	May compete for 6 months +21 days after the 2 <sup>nd</sup> vaccination of the Primary Course Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a vaccination (e.g. may enter venue after 7 August 2010)
Boosters	MINIMUM: within one year of previous booster vaccination  IF COMPETING: must be competing in the 6 months +21 days from the previous booster vaccination	Must have been vaccinated with the 6 months +21 days before arriving at the Event Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a vaccination

Exceptions to the requirement for FEI equine influenza vaccinations currently exist only for those Horses competing at CNs or CIMs where there are no national requirements for influenza vaccination in both the Event host country and the Horse's country of origin (General Regulations Article 137).

# EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL 2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1032

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport, their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, with regards to vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

# **HORSE INSPECTIONS 2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1033**

All Horses will be assessed for their orthopaedic fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit not to compete will be eliminated by the Ground Jury and not be permitted to continue in the competition.

### LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION

All Horses competing at the Event are subject throughout the Period of the Event to Examination under Article 1034 of the Veterinary Regulations, the Limb Sensitivity Protocol. The objectives of the Protocol are to: (i) safeguard the welfare of the horse, according to the

principles outlined in the Code of Conduct for the Horse, and (ii) to ensure a level playing field for all Athletes. Horses are not eligible to compete when a limb, or part of a limb, is hyposensitive or hypersensitive. Hypersensitive limbs have an excessive or abnormal reaction to palpation. Hyposensitive limbs include any alteration in sensitivity induced by a neurectomy or chemical desensitisation for as long as the alteration in sensitivity persists.

Horses may be examined under the Protocol at any time during the Period of the Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off and they may be examined once or on multiple occasions. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the Examination or are subject to immediate Disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses during the Event.

# 6. <u>EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION</u> 2013 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VI EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)

Within FEI Groups I & II, the Organising Committee should charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 towards the cost of the EADCMP, which is affected by the FEI Veterinary Department.

### **SAMPLING**

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures (2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1058).

### **CLEAN SPORT INFORMATION**

The current FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications is available on the FEI Clean Sport website: <a href="www.FEICleanSport.org">www.FEICleanSport.org</a> as a PDF document, database or smart phone app. Detection times are also provided for a limited number of Controlled Medication substances where available.

Elective Testing may be carried out, by Competitors for their Horses, prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances (please refer to <a href="www.FEI.org/veterinary">www.FEI.org/veterinary</a> for information and details).

### FEI LABORATORY FOR SAMPLE ANALYSIS

GROUPS I & II ONLY - FEI CENTRAL LABORATORY

Under Veterinary Regulations Chapter VI, Article 1057 within some geographical regions, as determined by the FEI Bureau, the Equine Anti-Doping Controlled Medication Programme (EADCMP) and procedure is administered by the FEI Veterinary Department. Therefore all samples collected in Groups I and II, must be analysed by the FEI Central Laboratory, currently Horseracing Forensic Laboratories (H.F.L) Sport Science, Quotient Bioresearch Limited Newmarket Road Fordham, Cambridgeshire CB7 5WW.

Samples collected outside of FEI Groups 1 and 2 may be analysed at an alternative FEI

# 7. <u>VETERINARY TREATMENTS, SUPPORTIVE AND OTHER THERAPIES 2013</u> Veterinary Regulations Chapter V

Veterinary treatment or supportive therapy required during an Event is under the control of the FEI Veterinary Official (Veterinary Delegate) and only permitted when:

- a) authorised using the appropriate Veterinary Form (see table below, or VRs article 1047-1051), either prior to the competition or prior to administration once the competition has begun;
- b) conducted within the designated Treatment Boxes and
- c) administered by an FEI Veterinarian (VRs article 1003) or Other Treating Professional (VRs article 1021).

Heated or magnetic blankets, physical therapy, ice and cold water, non-prohibited, authorised substances that are administered orally or by nebulisation, or those treatments exceptionally authorised by the Veterinary Delegate are allowed in the Horse's own stable.

### 8. VETERINARIANS AT EVENTS

2013 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter II

# **VETERINARY SERVICES MANAGER (VSM)**

All Organising Committees must appoint a FEI Veterinarian as a Veterinary Services Manager to be responsible for assisting the organiser in achieving the Minimum Veterinary Standards and facilities required for an FEI Event. The VSM must ensure sufficient numbers of treating veterinarians are available for the type of Event and the number of Horses attending. The VSM may be the event treating veterinarian themselves.

#### **FEI VETERINARIANS**

All veterinarians treating Horses during FEI Events, including Team Veterinarians, Athlete's Private Veterinarians and Treating Veterinarians must be registered with the FEI as FEI Veterinarians – either Permitted Treating or Official Veterinarians. Veterinarians must carry their FEI ID Card with them at all times when in attendance at Events and must present this on the request of FEI Stewards or Officials. Athletes are advised to ensure that any veterinarian they wish to treat their Horse during an Event is registered in the correct way with the FEI. Registering as an FEI Veterinarian does not give any automatic right to having accreditation which is issued by the event Organising Committee.

### 9. NOTES TO ORGANISING COMMITTEES

FEI Veterinary Delegates must verify that adequate facilities and services are provided by the Organising Committee prior to the start of the Event, and ensure that FEI Stewards are aware of the requirements for the authorisation of Veterinary Forms, other treatments and the FEI Veterinarian ID Card during Events.

Organising Committees must also ensure that there are adequately trained stewards or designated individuals who will liaise with FEI Veterinary Officials to assist with the supervision of treatment areas. The Veterinary Forms 1-4 must be kept by the FEI Veterinary Delegate, referenced and submitted in their report to the FEI within 72 hours.

#### 10. PONIES

For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement prior to the Horse Inspection (2013 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IV).

### 11. DOCTOR / MEDICAL SERVICE / FARRIER

Veterinary and medical assistance, as well as farrier services, are available for the duration of the event. These are at the expense of those requesting them.

When, in the opinion of the Show's veterinary surgeon, a horse is so severely injured that it ought to be humanely destroyed, the Person Responsible should where possible first be informed. However, the Show's veterinary surgeon may proceed wit the humane destruction, without reference to the PR, in order to prevent undue suffering to the horse. Before taking this action, the Show's veterinary surgeon should, wherever practicable, seek a second veterinary opinion. In such eventuality, owners are responsible for the cost of disposal.

#### 12. PRIVATE VETERINARY SURGEONS

Private veterinaries will have to report to the FEI Veterinary Delegate upon their arrival at the show grounds, before they will be accredited and be allowed to enter the restricted area.

Under no circumstance will any veterinary surgeon other than the veterinary commission be allowed to treat any horse at the CSI Amsterdam - 2014, unless permission in writing has been received from the FEI Veterinary Delegate. If permission is given, the veterinary concerned will be accompanied by the FEI Veterinary Delegate or by his representative.

#### 13. STABLES

All horses, entered for the competitions of the CSI Amsterdam - 2014 must be stabled in the official stables provided by the Organizing Committee (immediately after the official horse inspection) for the entire duration of the event.

They are not to be removed between the dates of Thursday January 23<sup>rd</sup> 2014, following the official horse inspection, and the last competition on Sunday January 26<sup>th</sup> 2014, in accordance with the relevant FEI rules.

Smoking inside the stables is strictly prohibited; offences against this rule, first will incur a fine and in case of a repeated offence, will lead to permanent exclusion from the stables by withdrawal of the accreditation of the person concerned.

### 14. EMERGENCY STABLE CARDS

ECSCs must be obtained from the stable managers office upon arrival at the event.

It is the responsibility of the rider/groom to complete the card in full and affix to their horses stable door for the duration of their stay at the show. Whilst every reasonable effort will be made to contact the owner/person responsible of the animal, if unsuccessful the Veterinary Surgeon on duty will treat the animal as he finds necessary.

# 15. IDENTIFICATION

For identification purpose all horses stabled must carry their identification number whenever leaving the stables; offences against this rule, will incur a fine.

# XI. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

At a minimum, and pursuant to the ADRHAs, Organisers must provide the following at Events where human anti-doping testing is scheduled to take place at least 2 months prior to the Event:

- **1**. One (1) staff member able to act as point of contact and coordinator for the *Doping Control Officers* (*DCOs*) with the contact name and details of this staff member to be communicated to the *FEI* at least two (2) weeks prior to the starting date of the *Event*.
- **2.** Human anti-doping facilities reasonably separated from public activity, consisting of:
- one (1) private room exclusively dedicated for use by the *DCOs* with one (1) table, two (2) chairs, pens and paper and one (1) lockable fridge; and
- a waiting room/area with a suitable number of chairs as well as an appropriate amount of individually sealed, non-caffeinated and non alcoholic beverages, which includes a mix of natural mineral water and soft drinks; and
- one (1) private and clean bathroom/toilet, adjacent or as near as possible to the *DCO* room and waiting area.
- **3.** Staff members (or volunteers) of both genders, able to act as *Chaperones*. The number of *Chaperones* available to the *OC* must be communicated to the *FEI* as early as possible following receipt by the *OC* of the *Testing* plan for the *Event*. # **DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY AT COMPETITIONS**

Allocation of money prizes will be based on one prize for each four athletes, with a minimum of five prizes per competition. Prize money will be paid on Sunday January  $26^{th}$  2014, after the last start of the competitor in Euro ( $\mathfrak{C}$ ). Up to an amount of  $\mathfrak{C}$  500,= maximum, prize money will be paid by the Organizing Committee in cash to the relevant athlete; in case the amount of prize money won exceeds the maximum mentioned above, prize money will be transferred to the athlete's bank account.

In accordance with the relevant specific Dutch tax regulations, no income tax will be deducted from prizes won by home athletes or by foreign athletes from a country with which the Netherlands have made a treaty in order to avoid double income tax levies. However, 20% income tax will be deducted from prize money won by foreign athletes, domiciled in a country with which The Netherlands do not have a similar tax treaty.

In all cases, athletes will be invited to provide all necessary information, in order to guarantee the correct tax procedure;; to this purpose all athletes must provide the Organizing Committee with a copy of the relevant pages of their passport and their home address. Every athlete is responsible for the correctness of the details he/she submits.

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for OCs to deduct such taxes, they <u>must</u> provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.

The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the OC prior to departing.

The total prize money for the competition must be distributed among the first 12 placed athletes. The OC must provide additional created prizes for athletes placed beyond 12<sup>th</sup> place. The minimum amount for each of these additional prizes, for athletes placed from 13<sup>th</sup> to last place, must be clearly specified in the approved schedule.

# **IMPORTANT**

Maximum Number of starters per competition: 100.

If more than 100 starters are entered, the OC must split the class and provide the equivalent amount of prize money for the additional Competition. OCs may apply either of the following methods for splitting the Competition:

The competition is split into two groups before it starts. There may be a different number of starters in each group. There may be athletes with multiple horses in each group but all horses of any one athlete must be in the same group.

# **OR**

The competition is run as one single competition and split afterward into two groups and the classification established as follows: the athlete with the best score is the winner of the first group, the athlete with the second best score is the winner of the second group and so on until prizes have been allocated to 25% of the total number of starters. NB: In this case separate results must be sent to the FEI for each of the two groups, e.g. results for Competition 1a and for Competition 1b.

In both cases above each group must offer the same amount of prize money as indicated for the original Competition.

Prequalified are if present the winning athlete (not athlete/horse combination) of the Grand Prix at CSI 4\* Amsterdam (NED) 2013, the current Dutch seniors' champion, the Individual medal winners (not athlete/horse combinations) at the last Olympic and Pan American Games, the FEI World and FEI Continental Championships and the winner of the FEI World Cup™ Final 2013;
- 2. In addition the athletes placed  $1_{st}$  up to and including  $20_{th}$  (including ties for  $20_{th}$  place) in the final results of competition S-3, will immediately be qualified for the Grand Prix. If athletes prequalified will be among these 20 athletes, the next best placed athletes in the result of competition S-3 will qualify for the Grand Prix as well;
- 3. Finally the best placed athletes in the result of competition S-6, if not yet qualified according to the provisions set under 1. or 2. above, will qualify for the Grand Prix, until the maximum number of 45 rider will be achieved.

### **Substitutions**

If an athlete qualified for participation in competition S-8 decides not to take his/her place, substitutions will be selected in down grading order from the result of competition S-6.
