The owner of the winning horse/pony is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix. The 8 best athletes of each class must take part in the prize giving ceremony on the horse they started in the corresponding competition (exception are only possible with the approval of the Ground Jury <u>and</u> the OC).

#### 4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

The settlement of amounts owed by the organizing committee for foreign riders will be based Forward art.130.2. Gains will be distributed, at the latest, at the end of the last competition. The art .30. II of the Finance Act for 1990, amending Article .182. B in January 1990, exposes persons domiciled outside France for artistic or athletic, supplied or used in France, restraint the specific source of 15% subject to the provisions of the International Conventions.

The O.C could also pay by bank transfer, the foreign riders have to give their particulars of one's bank account.

Through their entry in the competition, the participants accept that the OC and its agents cannot be held responsible for any accidents during the events and the duration of their stay at the same.

# THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

# FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

# 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
