Athletes are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF. One groom per Athlete.

1. Foreign and German Athletes

The best 15 Athletes from the Rolex Rankings No. 123 (max. 5 Athletes per foreign NF).

2. Further Foreign Athletes (up to a total number of max. 35 foreign Athletes):

- 1. 50 % must be selected from the TOP 600 of the Rolex Rankings No. 123.
- 2. 50 % are free (ranked or unranked Athletes).

3. Further German Athletes (up to a total number of max. 35 German Athletes):

Acc. to a special handicap agreed upon with NF GER.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting Athletes ("masterlist"), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

CSI Amateurs A and B

Admitted Athletes:

1. Approx. 15 foreign Athletes, who have been invited by the OC through their home NF



- 2. Approx. 25 German Athletes, who have been invited by the OC.
- 3. All Athletes:
 - Number of horses per Athlete: 3 horses of 6 years or over, however, max. 2 horses per competition.
 - The Athlete must be the owner of the horse(s) with which he/she competes. Ownership may be extended to family members.
 - Athletes must have an "Amateur Owner's" license of their respective NF, such a licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - An Amateur Owner licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - The buying and selling of horses, as well as receiving prize money in cash, are not forbidden providing they do not constitute the Athlete's mainly source of income.
 - Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, athletes are not barred from other competitions or Championships. As long as the athlete holds the "Amateur Owner" status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater.
 - Athletes participating in the CSI Amateurs may not start in any other international competition of the event.

VI. FACILITIES OFFERED

A) ATHLETES

Accommodation has to be made with the Reit- und Fahrverein Spangenberg - Turnierbüro -, Grüne Straße, D-34286 Spangenberg, Tel.: +49.1 76 – 13 33 45 90.

Accommodation and meals will be on the Athletes' own account.

B) GROOMS

Athletes themselves are responsible for the accommodation of their grooms. Grooms will receive free meals during the event. One groom per Athlete. Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC.

C) HORSES

The horses will be stabled from 30/06/2011 - 03/07/2011 in stable tents; the stabling fee is included in the entry fee. For horses additionally brought to the event or for tax boxes a fee of $150 \in$ (incl. VAT) will be levied. For waste disposal a fee of $40,00 \in$ per box (incl. VAT) will be charged. Forage, hay and shavings can be bought on site at the prices of the day. Own stable tents may not be set up. All horses must be stabled in the official stables on the showground. Electricity has to be ordered with the entries a fee of 50 EUR (incl. VAT) will be levied per lorry etc.

Per Athlete as many boxes as horses were entered on closing date of definite entries will be reserved! No boxes can be made available for horses not taking part in the event.



First bedding (shavings) is free of charge. The Athlete or horse owner has to take care of further bedding himself or further bedding and forage may be bought from the stable manager at customary prices.

There will be no reimbursement of transport charges.

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the Athlete or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

For questions pertaining to the veterinary and animal diseases legislation for horses from abroad and regarding the horses' transportation, the OC is ready to assist.

For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 40,00 EUR per horse.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification o the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to the sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid from will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

<u>VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT</u> CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective January 2009, updates effective 1st January 2011:

PASSPORTS (ART. 137)

- 1. Every Horse entered for any Competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in a country other than the country of the Horse's nationality, and all Horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, FEI Championships, Regional, Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, whether at home or away from the country of its nationality (see Article 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI passport, or a national passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, must be registered with the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.
- 2. Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in their country of nationality are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such Horses must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all Horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 7 months after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within one year of the last dose).



- 2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).
- 3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.
- 4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1st January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate. At CCI3* and CCI4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Cup Finals, Championships and Games it is recommended that a minimum of 5% of all horses (with a minimum of 3 horses tested) must be sampled (see also VR Art. 1016.5.).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

X. MISCELLANEOUS

By handing in the entry, each horse owner and authorised representative, by participating in the competitions, each Athlete acknowledges the General and Specific Conditions of the show, the rules of animal protection and the orders of the show direction.

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

Athletes placed 1st to 6th have to attend the prize-giving ceremony with the horse, they started in the respective competition (exceptions may only be granted by the Ground Jury and the OC.

The owner of the winning horse/pony is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix (comp. 6).



3. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

4. INSURANCES

All owners and Athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

5. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft, damages or other incidents.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER (, the Chefs d'Equipe) and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

7. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

Only Athletes, grooms, horse owners (max. two per horse acc. to the FEI passport) and veterinarians who are issued with a valid accreditation handed out in the show office are allowed to go into the restricted stable area.

Only Athletes and officials will be granted free admission to the VIP area. Further VIP accreditations can be bought in the show office.

Entry right to the stable are in accordance with VR Art. 1005.2.5.

8. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These Athletes will start first in these competitions.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
