

1. ATHLETES

2. GROOMS

Hotels and meals at their own expense.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water will be provided by the Organising Committee.

3. HORSES

Horses participating in the CSI3* classes, have to be minimum 7 years old. Only exception to this rule are the classes young horses (classes for horses of 6 and 7 years)

Young Horses are confined in young horses competitions and only !!!

Transport expenses to be paid by the athlete.

Stabling is free of charge. The bedding of all stables will be shavings. There is no straw available. The first bedding of <u>shavings</u> is provided free of charge. Additional bedding (shavings or hay) can be bought within the stable area at current prices and during certain hours. These hours will be posted at the show secretary and at the stable managers office.

The stables will be ready from **Wednesday**, **28**th **of September 2011 12 o'clock**. All horses Arriving before this time, have to inform the OC beforehand.

4. WELCOME

The time and date of arrival of athletes and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to assist them on arrival. All horses are to be on the showgrounds before 17.00 h on Wednesday. If electricity (40,00 euro) is required, please confirm beforehand on the entry sheet

5. ADDITIONAL FEES

The OC will charge a manure disposal fee of 30.euro-/horse, if the stables are not cleaned before leaving the show. The stable manager will check the cleaned stables on Sunday upon request of the athlete or groom before payment in the show office.

Each horse may only start once per day and max. 3 times over the 4 days.

9. PAYMENTS

Payments for entries, MCP or other costs are to be done at the showsecretary on Sunday October 2nd 2011 after the last class the competitor has participated in. Prizemoney will be paid at the same time.

Will be accepted as valid methods of payment: cash, Visa, Master card and American Express. Foreign cheques will be accepted but incur an extra cost of 75.00 euro (bankcosts).

Amounts over 1500.00 euro which have to be paid by the OC to an athlete, will be done solely by banktransfer. Please make sure you have your bank account number + the necessary numbers for the transfer to a foreign bank.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

1. OBJECTIONS/COMPLAINTS (Art. 167-171)

All complaints and objections to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. STARTING ORDER AND TIME TABLE

Entries for the classes have to be done each day before 18.00h, in the show office on official forms for the next day. The entries for the first day are to be made Thursday, September 29th 2011, before 12.00 h.

The starting order for the competitions will be as follows:

- First competition Draw
- I) Second and following competitions on rotation
- I) Grand Prix: special draw

Athletes wishing to school in speed competitions, must inform the OC before these competitions take place. These riders start first.

3. QUALIFICATIONS

There is a qualification for the Grand-Prix Memorial Van Geenberghe on Sunday: The first 30 placed athletes in the first Qualification (Class 2) and the first 30 placed athletes in the second qualification (class 5) will be allowed to participate in the Grand Prix on Sunday, each athlete with max. 1 horse. If however, an athlete qualifies with 2 horses or an athlete qualifies both on Thursday and Friday, the 31st ranked on Thursday, will be allowed to participate, then the 31st ranked on Friday, then the 32nd ranked on Thursday, the 32nd ranked on Friday, etc. Until the max. Of 60 athletes is reached.

Athletes are obliged to confirm their participation in class 9 (Grand-Prix) in the show office. If not, another athlete will be taken.

4. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

The athletes must take part in the prize giving ceremony on the horse they started in the corresponding competition. Bridle according to 260. On order of the Org. Com. the athletes must immediately assemble for the prize giving ceremony. The first 6 athletes of the class must present themselves in the prize giving ceremony.

5. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

If two or more horses tie for equal place, the prize money will be added and divided in equal parts. The organising Committee is allowed to deduct all outstanding fees from the eventual prize money that will be paid only to the horse owners or those persons responsible and not earlier than the end of the last class they participate in.

For foreign athletes all payments will be due according to Belgium law and tax regulations (18 % taxes on the prize money).

6. INSURANCES

The OC and its commissioners are not responsible for damages done to property, persons and fortune, caused by accidents and malady of athletes, horses and stable staff. Damages on coaches, harnesses, saddlery, stable utensils and all other objects (including damages of theft, fire) or other incidents are not under responsibility of the OC and its commissioners.

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horse. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 - 115)

In exceptional circumstances together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes will be notified to all competitors and Officials as soon as possible and they will be reported to the Sec. Gen. by the Foreign Judge.

8. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 133, 1005)

Individual athletes with one companion and one groom. In addition, horse owners get their passes according to the FEI-General Reg. Two owners max. per horse will be recognised. These show passes allow access all over the showgrounds. Public entrance is free. However they can only enter the public area's, not stabling area's nor the practice area.

9. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Training areas with practice obstacles are on the show grounds at the athletes disposal. No riding is allowed outside these dimensions of training areas. Schooling hours on the paddocks or main ring are allowed in the time between 1 hour before the first class and half an hour after the last class. The training schedule will be published at the show Office.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
