THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

NO MOTORBIKES AND NO QUADS ARE ALLOWED ON THE SHOWGROUND, INCLUDING STABLES, PARKINGS, EXERCISE AREAS AND ROAD BETWEEN STABLES AND SHOWGROUND.

ALL MORTORBIKES AND/OR QUADS WILL BE LOCKED BY THE POLICE

BECAUSE OF FREQUENT PROBLEMS, DOGS ARE NO LONGER ALLOWED ON THE SHOWGROUNDS. THANKS FOR YOUR UNDERSTANDING.

- o To avoid long classes, several classes are split up in different parts (A,B, etc with the same prize-money). These parts will always be maintained with a minimum of 40 horses per part but in any case: the scheduled prize- money will be payed.
