THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

IMPORTANT

The value of the 1st prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money distributed for the competition. The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (GR Art 127, 128)

The retail value of all prizes in kind must be mentioned as well as detail of model, type and special features for cars.

Instructions for breakdown of prize money:

- Maximum 1/3 of the total prize money for the competition to the winner.
- Break down for 1st to 8th place (at least) in a reasonable descending order of distribution must be listed in the Schedule.
- The minimum amount the last placed competitor receives must be indicated in the Schedule.
- <u>Minimum</u> 25% of competitors must receive prize money (one prize for every four starters), however minimum 5 prizes if there are 20 or fewer athletes taking part in the competition.
- The FEI has the right to alter the amounts proposed for distribution if the necessity arises.
