For every entry not cancelled 5 days before the day of the vet-check (04/05/2011), the stables 125€ per horse/pony have to be paid by the NF or the rider.

There is a first bedding of shavings in the stables(2 shavings). Additional shavings and hay can be bought within the stable area at current prices and during certain hours. Those hours will be announced. As stabling is limited, boxes for extra, not competitive horses or a tack-box can only be provided if asked before to the OC, at the price of $125 \in$ for every extra stable.

NO SMOKING IN THE STABLES

Al dung must be dropped in special containers at the stables. If violation stated by the stable manager, or by smoking in the stables, the ground jury can demand fine up to **1.000 CHF**.

EACH HORSE/PONEY CAN COMPETE IN MAXIMUM ONE CLASS PER DAY AND CAN RIDE MAXIMUM 3 DAYS DURING THE WHOLE SHOW.

3. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

Any horse entering on the Belgium Territory, whatever its country of origin outside EECF, must have a temporary Import authorization.for horses coming form abroad a health certificate proved that they are free from contagious disorders must be presented.

Non EC competitors are strongly advised to travel by ATA carnet.

There is not travel agency in charge.

The custom clearance should be made at the border. Custom formalities are at the competitors expenses..

NFs holding an international event in their country should inform their National Veterinary Authority and their Customs Authority at least four weeks beforehand. They should request every facility to assist the movement of horses accompanied by FEI Passports, and the necessary veterinary certification at frontier crossing points into and out of their countries. (Vet. Regl Art. 1004.2) Riders who need health papers for the horses/*ponies to cross the border, will have to pay the costs charged by the Ministry (37,5€ per health paper) The request documents has to be made at the secretary's office at arrival, anyway before Friday 06/05/11 before 12 a.m.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

When a team can only provide three Athletes and three ponies, its chef d'Equipe can start his three athletes and poneys. The starting order of the teams in the first round is determined by a draw. Fixed by the OC in agreement with the Ground Jury. All the number Ones start first in succession, then all the Number Twos an so on, teams comprising only Three Athletes may choose in witch of the three positions out of four they will start their athletes. All members of each team must take part in the first round except as stated in Art 264.4.2 and 5.2. The best six teams after the first round take part in he second round with four Athletes per team, except otherwise provided in Art 284.4.2 and 5.2. Those teams equal on penalties for sixth place will be separated by the total times of the three best athletes of each team in the first round. During the draw, the OC must decide whether the best home team will return for the second round as



seventh team, if it is not qualified among the six teams eligible to take part. The home team will only permitted to return for the second round if there is a difference of not more than eight penalties between the home team and the last qualified team for the second round. The starting order of the teams in the second round will be in reverse order of the total penalties the teams will retain the starting order of the first round. The Athletes in each team start in the same order as in the first round.

Classification of the teams not taking part in the second round is based on the total of penalties of the three best athletes of each team in the first round Teams with equality of penalties are placed equal.

Placing of teams after the second round is decided as follows:

The total penalties of the best three athletes per team in the first round are added tot the total penalties of the best three athletes per team in the second round.

In case of equality of penalties for the first place, there will be a jump off in which all team Athlete may take part.

The jump off takes place against the clock over minimum of six obstacles. The score in the jump-off is obtained by adding the penalties incurred by the three best Athletes in each team, but in the event of further equality of penalties, the times of these three Athletes in the jump-off added together will decide the winning team. In case of equality of penalties and time after the jump-off, the teams concerned will be placed equal first.

Teams with equality of total penalties for other places are placed equal.
