

The OC will charge a manure disposal fee of 30.euro-/horse, if the stables are not cleaned before leaving the show. The stable manager will check the cleaned stables on Sunday upon request of the athlete or groom before payment in the show office.

9. PAYMENTS



Payments for entries, extra stables, shavings, etc. are to be done at the show office on Sunday 25th of September 2011 after the last class the athlete has participated in. Prize money will be paid at the same time. The OC is allowed to deduct all outstanding fees from the eventual prize money that will be paid only to the horse owners or those persons responsible, and not earlier than the end of the last class the athlete participates in.

Accepted as <u>valid methods of payment</u>: cash money, Visa, Mastercard, American Express. Foreign cheques will not be accepted. However, should an athlete have no other means of payment then a cheque, 75,00 euro will be charged for the bank costs (cashing fee).

v. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

The first 6 riders of the class must attend the prize giving ceremony, on the horse they started in the corresponding competition. This ceremony will be held immediately after the last combination has left the arena. Athletes are to be ready in the practice arena by that time.

The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix.

2. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

For all foreign athletes, payments of prize money will be submitted to Belgian law and tax regulations (18 %)

If 2 or more athletes tie for an equal place, the prize money will be added and devided in equal parts.

3. INSURANCES

The OC and its commissioners are not responsible for damages done to property, persons etc., caused by accidents and malady of athletes, horses and stable staff. Damages on coaches, harnesses, saddlery, stable utensils and all other objects (including damages of theft, fire, etc) or other incidents are not under the responsibility of the OC and its commissioners.

6. OBJECTIONS/COMPLAINTS

To be valid, all complaints and objections must be done in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150,00 or the equivalent in another currency.

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule, the English version will be decisive.

Once the entry has been made, all athletes and owners accept the rules of the CSI2* 23-25 September 2011 Moorsele, as well as the conditions of the OC.

7. STARTING ORDER AND TIME TABLE

Entries for the classes have to be done each time the previous day before 18.00 o'clock in the show office on the official entry forms. The entries for the classes on Friday the 23^{rd} September must be done on Thursday the 22^{nd} of September before 18.00 o'clock.

Starting order for the competitions are as follows:

First class : draw

- Second and following classes: on rotation

- Grand Prix: special draw

Qualification for the GP: The best 35 athletes from the big class on Friday (class $n^{\circ}4$) and the best 35 athletes from the big class on Saturday (class $n^{\circ}8$) will be allowed to participate in the GP on Sunday, each athlete with 1 horse. If an athlete qualifies both on Friday and Saturday, the 36^{th} of Friday will be allowed to participate, then the 36^{th} of Saturday, then the 37^{th} of Friday, the 37^{th} of Saturday, etc. This means that a maximum of 70 athletes will be allowed to participate in the GP.



8. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school their horses in speed competitions, must inform the OC upon their entry. These athletes will start first.

Training areas with practice fences are on the show grounds at the competitors disposal. No riding is allowed outside these dimensions of training. Schooling hours on the practice arenas or on the main arena, will be posted at the show office. These hours will be approx. from 1 hour before the first class per day until half an hour after the last class.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
